JOEMC Member Honored in National #WhoPowersYou Contest

Jones-Onslow is proud to announce that Mary Ann LeRay was recently honored as the second place prizewinner of the Touchstone Energy Cooperatives 2019 #WhoPowersYou Contest.

“We offer our sincere appreciation, gratitude, and congratulations to Mary Ann,” said the co-op’s CEO, Jeff Clark. “We are very proud to serve her and her family as co-op members and grateful for everything she does to serve our local community.”

LeRay, Board Chairman of The Filling Station in Pollocksville, was honored for the non-profit organization’s work seeking to meet the nutritional, educational, and spiritual needs of the residents of Jones County.

The Filling Station opened its food pantry on September 6, 2018 but a week later was forced to temporarily close as Hurricane Florence’s heavy rains flooded the streets of Pollocksville and much of Jones County. On September 14, one week after the hurricane left most of the area underwater, the food pantry reopened its doors and operated as a disaster relief

site. For the next 14 weeks, more than 75 volunteers served over 10,000 people.

“We congratulate the commitment and generosity of Ms. LeRay and these inspiring contest winners, along with all the 2019 nominees,” said Jeffrey Connor, Touchstone Energy interim executive director. “They tirelessly demonstrate what it means to have a servant’s heart, and we are honored to recognize them for their dedication to our core cooperative value of commitment to community.”

LeRay and The Filling Station were awarded the second-place cash prize of \$2,000 and honored along with the three other #WhoPowersYou Contest winners from across the United States. Winners were chosen by an independent panel of judges, using criteria based on nominees’ positive impact on their local communities. ▼

High School Students: Apply to Spend a Week in Washington, D.C.

Are you a current high school junior interested in spending a week in Washington, D.C. learning about government, history and the cooperative business model, while building your leadership skills and making new friends from across the state and nation? If so, we invite you to apply for the 2020 Electric Cooperative Youth Tour!

Jones-Onslow EMC will sponsor four local students to join the June 20-26, 2020 Youth Tour. The all-expenses paid, week-long tour is hosted by electric cooperatives nationwide and is a tradition more than 50 years strong. About 1,800 students from more than 40 states are expected to participate in 2020, and North Carolina's electric cooperatives will send a delegation of more than 45 students.

The Youth Tour gives high school students the opportunity to experience Washington, D.C., and learn more about how they can make a difference as young adults. Tourists will pay their respects at historic monuments and memorials, meet with North Carolina's members of Congress on Capitol Hill

and tour a variety of Smithsonian museums, all while building a peer network with young leaders from across the country.

Students entering their senior year (current juniors) in Fall 2020 are eligible to attend and are encouraged to apply through JOEMC. Delegates will be selected through an essay contest with a pre-selected topic.

TIPS FOR PURCHASING NEW APPLIANCES

When shopping for new appliances, there are two price tags you should consider:

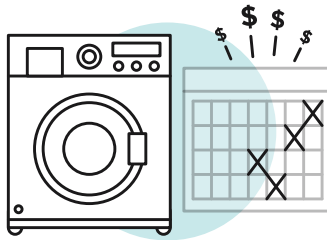
1.

Purchase price of the appliance (think of this as a down payment)



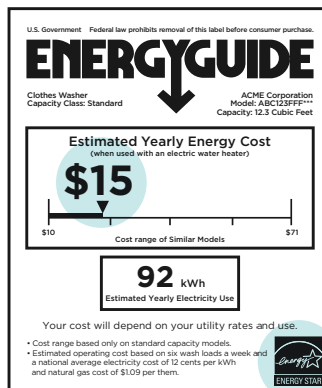
2.

Cost to operate the appliance over its lifetime (how much energy the appliance uses)



That second price is important because you'll be paying for the appliance's energy use for the next 10 to 20 years.

- Look for the ENERGY STAR® label. ENERGY STAR-qualified products exceed the federal minimum standards for efficiency and quality.
- Carefully review the EnergyGuide label on the appliance. The label provides information about how much energy an appliance uses compared to similar models.
- Once you choose your make and model, compare prices. Keep in mind, many retailers will match a lower price offered by competitors.
- Recycle or sell your old appliance. Ask the retailer if they'll pick up your old appliance, or you can sell it yourself. Either option is better than the landfill!

Asparagus Casserole

Ingredients:

- 1 pound asparagus, ends trimmed
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 6 eggs, beaten
- 3 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 1 small onion, diced
- 1 tall can evaporated milk
- 2 cups shredded Velveeta cheese
- ½ teaspoon salt
- Several turns freshly cracked black pepper

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease a 1½ quart baking dish.
2. Melt butter in skillet over medium heat. Cut asparagus into 1-inch pieces and sauté in butter 3 to 4 minutes until tender.
3. Combine asparagus with all the other ingredients and stir to combine. Pour into prepared baking dish. Bake about 30 minutes until it sets in center and starts to brown on top.
4. Let stand about 10 minutes, and serve while hot.

Note: This can be mixed a day ahead to bake at serving time.
